Mid-year Report 2019

(January to June)

Losar, the beginning of the Earth Female Pig Year, was celebrated in Ogyen Choling on the 5th of February with the usual enthusiasm and renewed hopes for a blessed and happy year. As usual, members of the village came together to participate in the invocations and celebration starting with the time honoured tradition of *shudrel phuensum tshogpa* in the Dolma Lhakhang (Tara Temple)..

Prayers and Rituals

The year began with some religious fervour as demonstrated by the performance of the reading of the Bum (Prajnaparamita) , which was conducted in February. A few days later a household from the village and the Foundation jointly hosted the ritual of *chöd* in the Dolma Lhakhang The annual *Gonpoi dudchod* was performed in June. A group of households in the village hosted another ritual of *chöd*, performed by 10 lay people, disciples of Dungsey Garab Rinpoche in the Dolma Lhakhang towards end of June. The group comprised of men and women. It was new experience for many, to see women practitioners who had tend to their babies and small children during the ritual! It is hoped that this religious fervour will continue into the year.

Museum

The work of installing window frames continued over the period covered by this report. This work should be completed within the next six months. Two rooms on the ground floor of the *utse* have been emptied and are being readied for the new exhibits.

The museum had visitors nearly every day. We noted a significant increase in the number of Bhutanese visitors to the museum and the temples.

Guest House

The guest house operators were happy to be awarded the 3 star rating for the guest house by the Tourism Council of Bhutan (TCB). The approval for the award came after a second visit by an assessment team. The occupancy rate of the guest house is picking up and, we continued to receive a few guests right into June, which is usually considered the lean months for tourism in Bumthang. Besides the regular guests we were happy to host some special groups namely;

- Frequent visitor and friend of Ogyen Choling, Wendy Erd, writer and film maker from Alaska and Hanoi, came with a writers' group and stayed with us for three nights in April. Some teachers from Tang Central School Misethang, were invited to join the writers for a fun interactive creative writing workshop. The writing was based on the artefacts in the museum.

- Samten, a travel agent from the village brought an international group of Tibetan medicine practitioners, led by Dr. Nida Chenatsang the Co-founder of Sorig International. Over the three days Dr. Nida guided the group in practice and meditation in the temple.
- In June we had the pleasure of hosting Asha Karma, the founder of the Voluntary Artists Studio Thimphu. (VAST). He was accompanied by the renowned Thai artist Dr. Suchart and his wife.

Four of the kitchen staff of the Heritage House have received their food handlers' licence from BAFRA (Bhutan Agriculture and Food Regulatory Authority).



Through the Swiss Bhutan Friendship Association, we were fortunate to be introduced to Ms. Annagret Schlumpf, a Swiss consultant in gastronomy and housekeeping. Ms. Schlumpf stayed here for over 3 weeks in March, giving the staff of the Heritage House hands-on training in cooking and housekeeping. On her recommendation and with the help of her friends and contacts in Switzerland, Ms. Pema Yangdon, who leads the team in the Heritage House, was able to go to Switzerland for a two months internship. Pema Yangdon will be based in Centro Magliaso but will have the opportunity to look at different hotels in Switzerland.

The boundary wall was completed in March. Within the well protected area, around the mani



walls the villagers have planted decorative plants and trees. It was decided to plant mostly local perennial species. The initiative was in response to Bumthang Dzongkhag's declaration of beautifying Bumthang under the slogan of *Beautiful Bumthang*. Many of the trees and plants have survived under the collaborative care of the villagers. We are still looking at building a small playground for the children from the village. We have acquired the timber and have looked at samples of locally made play structures.

The installation of CCTV as a security system guarantees a sense of security but it also reminds us that the possibility of a breach of trust is a constant reality. A local entrepreneur, Tsewang Dorji, assisted by the staff spent over one week, installing the CCTV with 14 cameras located in areas in and around the museum, temple and the Heritage House.
