So, we worked continually on the upkeep, regular maintenance and improvements to the museum and the Heritage House.

It was with high expectation that the farmers enthusiastically harvested their potato this season. They hoped that their good harvests would bring good prices. However, the uncertainties and the fluctuations in the price of the crop is causing some anxiety.

We recorded over 325 tourists, 686 Bhutanese visitors including non payers and 313 students visited the museum and the temple in the last three months.

Maintenance Work

We have now reached at stage in terms of repairs and maintenance that we have no major new projects that require extra labor. Almost all the maintenance work are being carried out by the permanent staff without budgetary implications. Some of the works completed during the reporting period were major, remodeling a bathroom, fence repairs, work on the gate and the parking retention wall.

We are fortunate to have the temple caretaker Ngawang Jampa in our team. He works continually on the painting jobs around the Foundation and in addition he takes the initiative to contribute his labor and his skills to the Foundation. He contributed paint and painted the parts of the temple roof which had been replaced after the damage from the storm some years ago. He took the responsibility to repair an old canopy which will be used in the Tara lhakhang.
